Ride the Rails



13-19 March

Rediscover the joys of train travel as we enjoy the world renowned TranzAlpine (Christchurch to Greymouth) and the scenic Coastal Pacific (Christchurch to Blenheim) excursions. Uncover the unique history of NZ rail and talk to genuine railway enthusiasts.

This morning we visit Ferrymead Heritage Park featuring an Edwardian township including a historic railway station, workshops and model railways, to name but a few of the exhibitions/museums on site. A favourite with many is the vintage machinery and hall of flame (fire engines). We meet with members of the Canterbury Railway Society for a special charter and tour of their workshops, enjoying a picnic lunch today (included). This afternoon we journey out to Waipara to join the historic rural Weka Pass Rail excursion from Glenmark Station to Waikari and return.

Our train today will either be their 1909 'A' class Pacific steam loco no. 428 - the only one of its type still operating, or one of their equally impressive Dg class Diesel-electric locos, built in 1956 and weighing over 65 tons. We return to Christchurch, dining in again in anticipation of our early start to board the TranzAlpine next morning.

Garden City Getaway



22-28 March

We head to the Garden City of Christchurch to enjoy a relaxing holiday exploring and discovering. View the city from the height of a London double decker bus, dine in style on the Christchurch Tram and visit Ohinetahi - the famous garden of Sir Miles Warren. Set the alarm to get up for breakfast with the huskies at the Antarctic Centre and encounter the rare Hector's Dolphin on Akaroa Harbour.

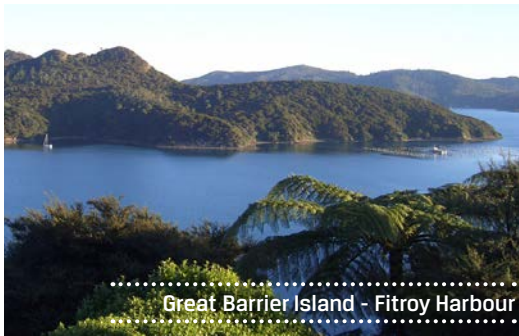
Read a sample of the itinerary

Set the alarm, as we don't want to be late for our breakfast date with the huskies and penguins at the International Antarctic Centre. We get close and cuddly with these incredible animals and enjoy an informative talk with Husky Rescue NZ over breakfast, and then you will be free to explore the other fantastic exhibitions at the centre.

This afternoon we visit the Transitional Cathedral, affectionately known as the "Cardboard Cathedral". The Cathedral makes use of varied construction materials from cardboard tubes to timber beams, structural steel and concrete, and its feature triangular window design incorporates images from the original Cathedral's rose window. We then make our way back to our hotel for a little relaxation, and a chance to freshen up for dinner before we take you out for a special dining experience on the Christchurch tram. Combining colonial style fine dining with an inner-city sightseeing tour, this is a must do Christchurch experience.

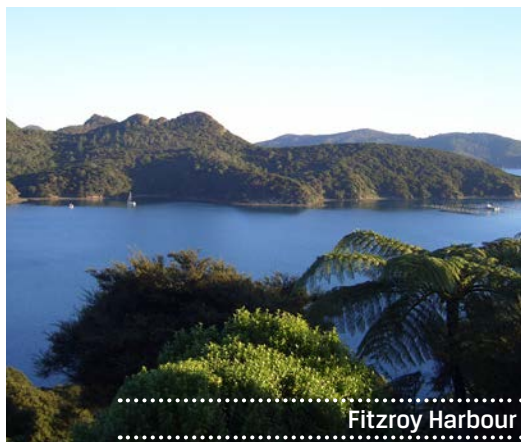
Autumn Colours

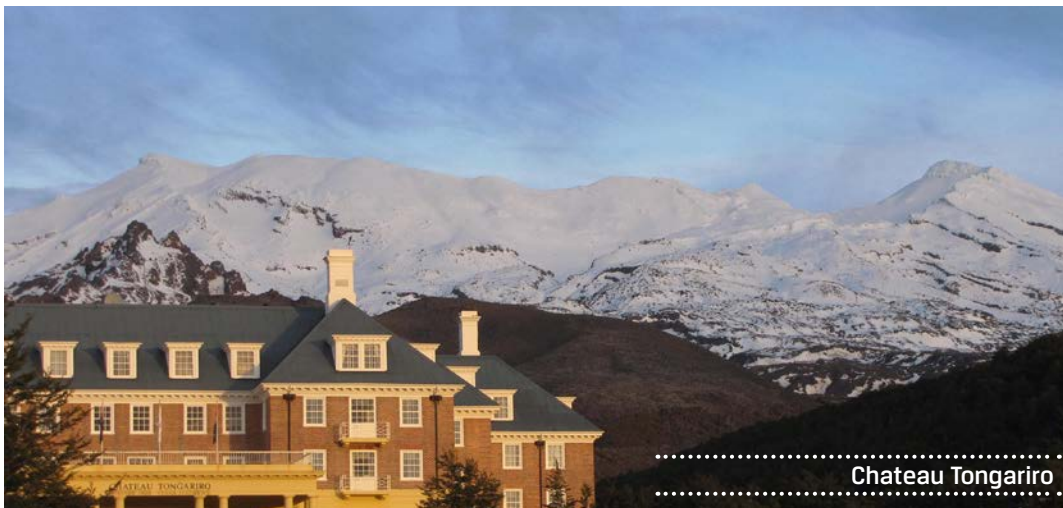

Southern High Country Adventures

As you probably know, a number of our tours this year were rescheduled into the latter part of 2020, due to the dreaded Covid-19. This made for a very busy end to our touring year, when it began to feel like I was never home. Lucky for me I got to pack my husband as well, but my fur family were less impressed.

However, Te Waipounamu (the South Island) was calling, and our series of High Country adventures kicked off in November. Without a doubt this is my favourite part of the world; the incredible tussock landscapes scoured by great glaciers, the lakes that look like cut glass, the rolling countryside dotted with sheep and backdropped by the Southern Alps, the massive, braided river valleys. We hugged Clydesdales and ancient totara, glimpsed tiny spotted fawns hiding in the grass and lunched on the banks of the Rakaia River with views up into its headwaters. We went 4 wheel driving over remote landscapes and jet boating far up the Waimakariri River, and we met amazing, strong, rural people with fascinating stories to tell of their lifestyles.

Keeping Safe on Tour

Our passengers and team members health and safety are our highest priority. We have been and continue to take advice from the NZ Ministry of Health on best practice personal safety protocols. We have contacted all our key suppliers before going on tour to ensure that they are observing the same safety protocols as a minimum.

On board our coaches we will be carrying out the following:

- **Hygiene** - We are providing hand sanitizer, and encourage it to be used when disembarking and entering the coach
- Provide individual snaplock bags for each passenger to dispose of personal rubbish including tissues and face masks
- **Cleaning** - All hard surfaces daily with a disinfectant and have a disinfectant to use in the air con filters.
- We have changed our food and drink handling procedures by moving from washable cups on the road to biodegradable disposable cups.
- We are carrying tongs for any food handling and our Staff are using gloves for any food handling
- **Personal Protective Equipment** - We have disposable face masks available for those that wish to wear them, or passengers are welcome to bring and use their own. However these are not compulsory.
- Contact Tracing - QR Codes are available for those that wish to scan using the NZ COVID-19 contact tracing app. We also have a detailed Itinerary which is kept with the guide.
- **First Aid Kits** and our staff are fully trained in first aid.
